



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Between

Life Chiropractic College West

and

Kadi Sarva Vishwavidyalaya

Introduction

Life Chiropractic College West (LCCW) and the Kadi Sarva Vishwavidyalaya (KSV) jointly referred to as "Participants", share a common belief in the importance of promoting education and training in the field of CHIROPRACTIC in India.

The present Memorandum of Understanding provides a framework in which participants may identify and explore cooperation in the area of providing high quality education, and training in the field of chiropractic in India. It further depicts the common intention of setting up a branch campus of **LCCW** in association with **KSV** for rendering formal education in the field of **CHIROPRACTIC.**

The Participants intend that, in order to pursue these mutual objectives, the requisite activities may be conducted, on mutually agreed topics at mutually agreed times and subject to available resources, during the term of this MOU.

SCOPE

This MOU serves as a written understanding of agreed upon principles between LCCW and KSV concerning a set of general academic objectives.

This MOU is intended to clarify the nature and extent of the complementary activities that might be undertaken for the mutual benefit of the two parties.

This MOU is intended for the design, development and implementation of Chiropractic program in India in association with KSV, which may be known as Branch Campus of LCCW in India.

This MOU is intending to provide the Education and training to the student enrolled under the Chiropractic programme and providing the clinical training, testing, application, development of newer method and research aspect for practice of chiropractic in India.

The MOU shall act as a preliminary document before a formal agreement of Collaboration is executed by and between the parties to the present MOU.

ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES OF LCCW

1. To commence a branch campus in India in order to impart a degree of Doctor of Chiropractic in India.

- **2.** LCCW shall assist KSV in obtaining legal clearances and affiliations from the requisite government agencies/bodies to run the Doctor of Chiropractic programme at its branch campus being established in association with KSV.
- **3.** LCCW shall be responsible to design and compile the academic curriculum for the Doctor of Chiropractic Programme as per the norms laid down by the accrediting agencies.
- **4.** LCCW shall improvise and impart an introductory programme for creating awareness about the Chiropractic amongst the students of KSV.

ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES OF KSV

- 1. KSV shall provide the infrastructure and administrative support to LCCW to commence and run its branch campus in India.
- **2.** KSV shall create general awareness about the Chiropractic programme amongst students in Gujarat and across India.
- **3.** KSV shall depute lecturers from its own university, who shall pursue the Doctor of Chiropractic program at Life Chiropractic College West at Hayward, California.
- **4.** KSV shall assist LCCW in obtaining legal clearances and affiliations from the requisite government agencies/bodies to run the Doctor of Chiropractic programme at its branch campus being established in association with KSV.

JOINT RESPONSIBILITIES & ACTIVITIES

KSV AND LCCW have agreed to the below mentioned points

1. KSV & LCCW shall form a task force/committee to work on the establishment and running of the Chiropractic Program. The members of the task force shall be as follows:

For KSV

- iii. Dr. Kalpesh Ghelani
- iv. Mr. Parth Thakkar- Consultant
- 2. KSV will send a delegation to the campus of LCCW in Hayward, CA USA on a mutually agreed date for a better understanding of Chiropractic Programme being run by LCCW at its campus and also have a better insight about the infrastructural requirements for setting up the College in India.
- 3. KSV & LCCW shall jointly engage a reputed law firm to have a clear insight about the legal guidelines and hurdles for establishing the branch campus of LCCW and for imparting the Degree of Doctor of Chiropractic in India. The costs for the same shall be equally shared between the parties to the MOU.
- 4. KSV & LCCW shall setup a Chiropractic Service Camp in India on a mutually agreed date.

- 5. KSV & LCCW shall make joint efforts to promote the Chiropractic Programme in India.
- 6. KSV & LCCW shall propose business models and amicably decide on the same as and when required.

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

Course material and handouts that shall be provided by LCCW shall be an intellectual property of LCCW and shall be protected by the applicable Intellectual Property Laws. KSV undertakes not to reproduce the course material or handouts, whether directly or indirectly either wholly or in part, to adapt, neither modify, translate illustrate, sell nor publicize any part thereof.

CONFIDENTIALITY

Both the parties to the MOU, i.e. KSV & LCCW undertake to respect the confidentiality of information and documents of any nature, that the other party might have access to by the virtue of being a party to the activities being carried out jointly or by the virtue of being a party to the present MOU or by any other incidental manner.

TERMINATION

Either institution may terminate the MoU by giving written notice of 30 Days in advance to the other institution. Once terminated, neither LCCW nor KSV will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other institutions may suffer. However, LCCW and KSV will ensure that the provisions of this Memorandum shall continue to apply to all activities in progress until their completion.

DISPUTE RESOLUTION

In case, there be a dispute relating to any aspect of academic cooperation, President LCCW and KSV will jointly resolve the dispute in a spirit of independence, mutual respect, and shared responsibility.

CONCLUSION

The present MOU is intended to continue till the execution of a formal agreement between the parties. The present MOU does not create any legally binding or enforceable obligations, express or implied. It serves only as a record of each participant's intention to undertake the activities as contemplated by this document.
